Finished Measurements

7.5" circumference x 4.25" tall

Materials

Cascade 220 (100% wool; 220 yds/100g)

- 9543 Midnight (MC) – 20 yds
- 16344 Vinci (MC) – 20 yds
- 8892 Azure, 8505 White, 1006 Sky Blue, 9465B Burnt Orange, 7827 Goldenrod (CCs) – small amounts

Needles: US Size 5 (3.75 mm) set of dpns or size needed to obtain gauge

Hook: US Size G-6 (4 mm) or size to obtain gauge

Notions: Tapestry needle, leather tag (optional)

Gauge

21 sts x 28 rows = 4" in stockinette stitch
18 sts x 20 rnds = 4" in single crochet

Pattern Notes

These beverage cozies (koozies? cozies? How do you spell it??!) have knit and crochet versions, and a plethora of embellishment options. Follow the charts, or use them as inspiration and come up with your own unique coozie!

Embellishment techniques include duplicate stitch, faux french knots, applied slip stitch crochet, and the simple, yet mighty running stitch.

Shown on beverage cans, these cozies will also work on bottles. Hand make these for your dad, for yourself, or for anyone who enjoys a cold one.

Crochet Pattern:

Rnd 1 (RS): With MC, fhdc 32, join to work in the rnd, turn.

Rnds 2-3 (WS): Ch 1, fphdc in each st around, join with sl st to beg fphdc. Turn after rnd 3.

Rnd 4 (RS): Ch 1, sc in each st around, join with sl st to beg sc, turn.

Rnd 5 (WS): Ch 1, sc in each st around, join with sl st to beg sc, turn.

Rnds 6-18: Rep Rnds 4 & 5, ending with a Rnd 4. Do not turn after Rnd 18. Switch to smaller hook.

Rnd 19 (RS): Ch 1, hdc in each st around, join with sl st to beg hdc, turn.

Rnds 20-21 (WS): Ch 1, fphdc in each st around, join with sl st to beg fphdc. Fasten off.

Knit Pattern:

With MC, cast on 40 sts. Distribute evenly between dpns and join to work in the rnd.

Rnd 1: * K1, p1; rep from * to end.

Rnd 2: * P1, k1; rep from * to end.

Rnds 3-6: Rep Rnds 1-2, 2 more times.

Rnds 7-28: Knit.

Rnds 29-34: Rep Rnds 1-6. Bind off all sts kwise over the next rnd.

Finishing

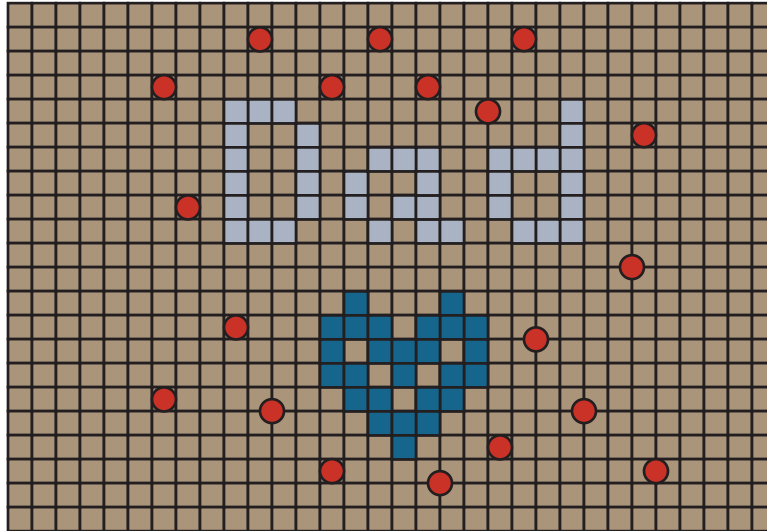
Weave in ends. Using charts as a guide, add embellishments! Sew leather tags to lower edge of coozies.

Abbreviations

beg	beginning
CC	contrast color
ch	chain
dpns	double pointed needles
fhdc	foundation half double crochet
hdc	half double crochet
k	knit
MC	main color
p	purl
rep	repeat
rnd(s)	round(s)
RS	right side
sc	single crochet
sl st	slip stitch
st(s)	stitch(es)
tbl	through the back loop
WS	wrong side



Knit Version One



- “Dad” & Heart use duplicate stitch
- Orange dots are a faux french knot: bring yarn to the front of the work, make an overhand knot, take the yarn to the back of the work just away from the entry point



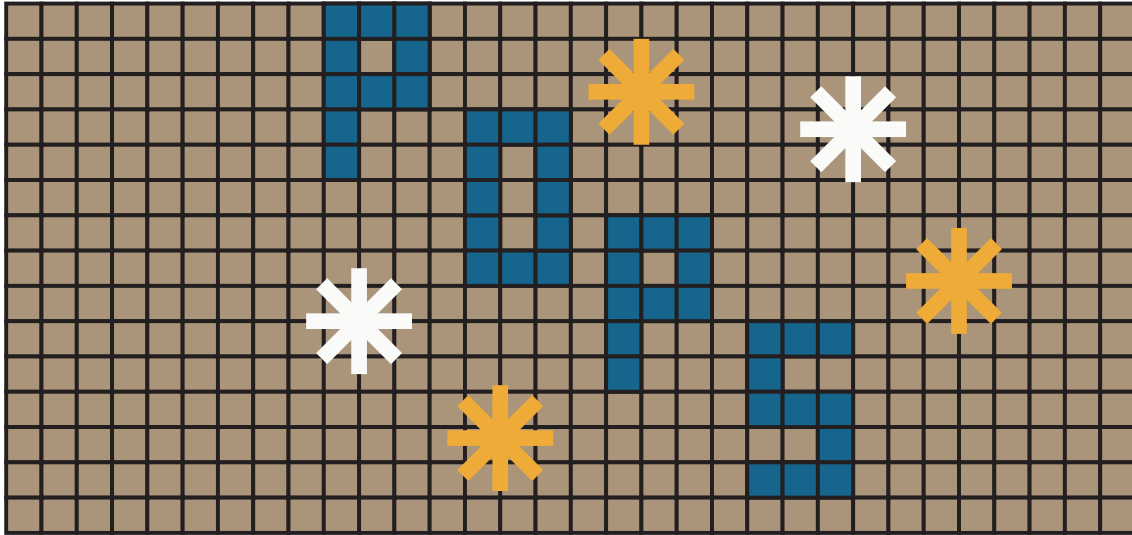
Knit Version Two



- “Pops” uses duplicate stitch
- Lines are simply running stitch. Be sure not to pull the yarn tightly across the back of the work when going from line to line.



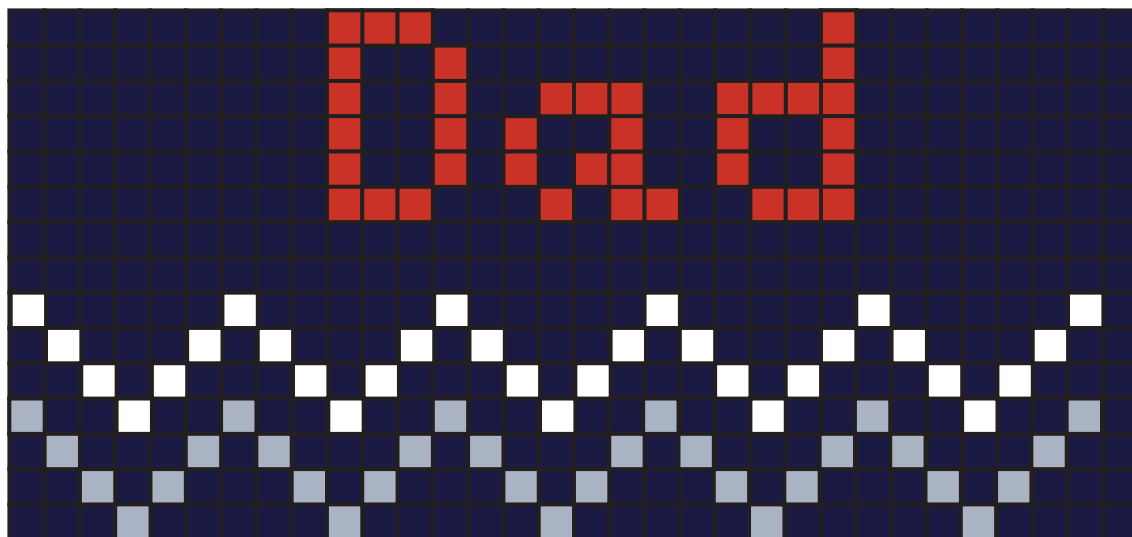
Crochet Version One



- “Pops” uses surface slip stitch crochet
- The stars are running stitch



Crochet Version Two



- "Dad" & the chevron lines use surface slip-stitch crochet



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
