Finished Measurements

8" wide x 80" long

Materials

Qing Fibre Yak Singles (65% merino wool, 20% silk, 15% yak; 120g/524 yds)

- Aflame (A) 1 skein
- Smoke (B) 1 skein
- Nest (C) 1 skein
- Hurricane (D) 1 skein

Needles: US Size 6 (4 mm) 16" circular or

size needed to obtain gauge

Notions: Stitch marker, tapestry needle

Gauge

20 sts x 28 rnds = 4" in stockinette stitch

Pattern Notes

Stripes, stripes, and more stripes! This simple stockinette project is all about the interplay of color, but mostly about finding a good excuse to knit with Qing's Yak Single. The fabric of this scarf is lush and drapey, and feels downright amazing on the skin!

Shown in four colors, only about half the yarn is used, so this size scarf could be made in only two skeins if desried. Or, simply make two scarves with four skeins!

Weaving in the ends as you go is recommended, as it won't be possible to do so after the ends of the scarf have been closed.

Pattern:

With color A, cast on 100 sts using a provisional method. PM and join to work in the rnd, being careful not to twist sts. Knit



60 rnds.

With B, knit 6 rnds.

With A, knit 17 rnds.

Rep last 2 stripes/23 rnds, 6 more times.

With B, knit 6 rnds.

With C, knit 33 rnds.

With B, knit 9 rnds.

Rep last 2 stripes/42 rnds, 4 more times

With D, knit 6 rnds.

With B, knit 6 rnds.

Rep last 2 stripes/12 rnds, 9 more times. With D, work in St st for 4" or until piece measures 80" from cast-on edge.

Place last 50 sts of the rnd on a separate needle. Join to the first 50 sts of rnd using kitchener stitch. Repeat with cast-on edge of scarf.





Weave in any remaining ends and block.

Abbreviations

knit

marker m

place marker PM

repeat rep rnd(s) round(s) stitch(es) st(s)
