

## Make No Mistake Scarf

### A Scarf to Knit or Crochet

Designed by Jeanne Giles and Jimmy Beans Wool.

We designed this scarf to be knit or crochet (download separate directions for each below) out of one of our favorite yarns, the Rowan Lima. Love this scarf? So does Real Simple Magazine! In fact, we put a scarf kit together using the Rowan Lima and this free pattern just for their readers. Check it out! The kit is featured in the January 2011 issue of Real Simple - on the last page of the magazine.

#### **Yarn:**

Rowan Lima: 50g and 109 yards

**Knit Version:** 1 Ball each of Colors 885 Machu Picchu (A), 888 Lima (B), 890 Bolivia (C), 886 Puno (D).

**Crochet Version:** 1 Ball each of Colors 878 Patagonia (A), 891 La Paz (B), 886 Puno (C), 893 Argentina (D).

#### **Approximate Finished Size After Blocking:**

Knit: 60" by 7"

Crochet: 85" x 8"

#### **Gauge:**

Knit: 16 sts = 4 X 4 inches in stockinette.

Crochet: 2 sts tall x 3 st wide = 1 X 1 inches in double crochet

#### **Supplies:**

Knit: 1 pair US 10 32" circular needles (or size to achieve gauge)

Crochet: 1 pair 6.0MM Crochet Hook

**Skill Level:** Beginner

#### **Abbreviations:**

CO = Cast on

K = knit

P = purl

RS = right side

WS = wrong side

\* \* = repeat instructions within

sts = stitches

Ch = Chain

DbICr = Double Crochet

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## **KNIT VERSION**

### **Directions:**

CO 243 sts using the cable cast on, leaving a 5 inch tail (or desired length - this will become your fringe).

You may want to place a marker every 20 sts to help in counting your stitches. Check JimmyBeansWool.com for videos on how to do a cable cast on. If you would like a longer scarf just cast on 4 more stitches for every extra inch you desire.

CO row counts as row 1. Begin pattern, changing colors every 3rd row on the RS, using your A, B, C, D color sequence.

Row 1: \* K2, P2 \* until last 3 sts, K2, P1

\*\* Each time you reach the end of a row you will cut a 5 inch tail for fringe.

Repeat row 1, changing colors on every RS row

Approaching the End:

Once desired width is reached, work one RS row with the next color in the sequence.

Then cast off on WS row as follows:

Loosely K1, P1, pass knit stitch over purl stitch, drop off, K1 pass purl stitch over knit stitch.

Continue as established in the K1, P1 pattern loosely. This cast off keeps the stitches from leaning to one side or the other and finishes the piece off nicely.

Finishing:

Trim your fringe and then block lightly.

## **CROCHET VERSION**

### **Directions:**

Set Up Row: Using A, Ch 250 sts. Turn.

Row 1: Continuing with A, Ch 2 sts. DblCr into each of the chain stitches until you reach the end of the row. Turn.

\*\* Each time you reach the end of a row you will cut a 5 inch tail for fringe (or your desired fringe length).

Row 2: Using B, Ch 2 sts. DblCr into each of the chain stitches until you reach the end of the row. Turn.

Repeat row 2, working your way through the sequence of colors 3 times.

Cut your yarn and pull the loose end of the yarn through the loop.

Finishing:

If desired and with remaining yarn, cut additional lengths of various colors for fringe and attach to ends of scarf.

Trim your fringe and then block lightly and lying flat to dry.

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
